



## midwest access project Clinical Training Application Guide

**Thank you for your interest in training with Midwest Access Project (MAP).** MAP is a nonprofit organization based in Chicago, IL. MAP **works with medical students, nursing students, residents, advanced practice clinicians, and licensed physicians** to coordinate reproductive health training rotations to meet the individual needs of each trainee. MAP is not a health center or clinical site and does not provide any direct patient care. MAP works with a network of providers throughout the Midwest to coordinate and provide training rotations to MAP trainees.

Our clinical training application will require **approximately 30 minutes to complete**. Since **draft applications cannot be saved** for later revisions, please **be prepared to complete the entire application in one session**. To assist you, we are sharing several of the application questions that you may want to consider drafting responses to before beginning the online application. ### **Application Questions You May Wish to Prepare for in Advance:**

- What is your primary interest or reason for seeking training with MAP? (1000 characters max)
- Identify up to three goals you'd like to accomplish during this training rotation, being as specific as possible.
- As you envision providing Sexual/Reproductive Health (SRH) care in your clinical practice, where do you see yourself providing these services? Please describe the geographic location (state(s) and urban/suburban/rural), the care setting, whether other SRH services and/or providers are in that area, and the impact your practice would have on that community. Would you live in that community or travel in to provide care? (2000 characters max)
- Would you like to say more about your plans, your commitment to SRH care, or details about how you plan to integrate SRH into your future work? Do you envision any obstacles to integrating SRH into your work? How might you overcome them? (1000 characters max)
- When would you like to do your clinical training? You'll be able to provide up to three options.
- If you will have other clinical or educational obligations during the rotation, please explain. (200 characters max)
- Midwest Access Project has training opportunities in Illinois (Chicago, Peoria, and Granite City), Minnesota (Minneapolis), and Nebraska (Bellevue). You will be asked to rank your preferred training location, with the option to select N/A if you would not be able to travel to a specific location.
